Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today, I am writing to share a letter that Fr. Sean Carroll, SJ, Provincial of the Jesuits West Province, shared with us. You can find the Provincial's letter in this weekend's bulletin.

As you can see, the Jesuits West Province has begun a discernment process for apostolic planning across the entire province. At first glance, the letter can raise anxiety, speculation, and conclusions based on fear. Will St. Leo remain a Jesuit parish, will Sacred Heart, what about Bellarmine? These are the sort of questions that anxiety and speculation can generate.

The letter explains why an apostolic plan is necessary. It also explains how it will happen. I am sure that the three apostolic works (St. Leo, Sacred Heart, and Bellarmine) will be engaged as the process evolves. Groups will convene to assist in this critical process guided by the attentive listening to the Holy Spirit. However, if we are going to be guided by the Holy Spirit, let us suspend speculation and judgment.

More information will be provided by Fr. Ed Fassett, SJ, delegate to the Provincial for apostolic planning. As more information becomes available to me, I will share it so that you will know how Sacred Heart and St. Leo will participate in this discernment process.

As we celebrate Spirit Weekend, may we continue to be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit during this time of discernment. May we live this coming year with great hope and joy, as the three parables in Sunday's Gospel indicate. May we do the hard work of the widow, who lost a coin, the shepherd, who lost a sheep, and the father, who lost a son.

Let us come together this weekend to celebrate the start of a new cycle at St. Leo.

Dear Brothers and Partners in Mission:

I hope that you are all enjoying the summer.

As you may know, last month I delivered an address on the state of the province at our congregation in Spokane. I spoke about the fact that we are at a pivotal moment in the history of our still-young Jesuits West Province and asked that we engage in apostolic planning to look together into God's heart, to discern where we, as Jesuits and lay collaborators, are being invited to go.

Why is this a pivotal moment? What might happen if we missed this opportunity to engage in prayer and conversation with one another to discern the path upon which God is calling and sending us?

At the core of our Ignatian identity is the experience of being missioned in a union of minds and hearts. We are called to generous service that gives life — both to ourselves and to others. In doing so, our hearts look to the Lord to lead us, guide us and labor with us. We do this as individual men and women, and we do this as a body. But given the many demands of our good and vital work, it can be easy to begin losing sight of the Lord. It is then that we know that we must stop, look around and notice how he is present and at work.

When I look at our province, I see how busy we are with so many good ministries. We do extraordinary work that reveals Christ to our world, even as the resources of the province itself, both human and temporal, are diminishing. I believe we do so because, even in this diminishment, we are richer than ever in the ways that we share the abundance of our Ignatian spiritual heritage and in the deep commitment to partnership in ministry we live out every day.

At the same time, we cannot take any of this for granted. For if we do, we could soon find ourselves losing sight of the Lord. So, we must be intentional and deliberate in discerning how the Lord is calling us: to find life and grace in our diminishment on the one hand; and to bring even greater life through our spiritual heritage and partnerships on the other. If we fail to do this now, we will soon — too soon — find ourselves walking down paths where the Lord is no longer so evident to us, not because he is not there, but because we have forgotten how to recognize him and listen to him. We would then begin a time of wandering — losing our way, stumbling along, feeling the darkness closing in upon us, becoming afraid and uncertain, and, finally, losing that unity and sense of mission that define us.

Therefore, I am inviting each of you to participate in our apostolic planning process, which will be a time of listening to the Lord together. It will be grounded in Ignatian discernment, the Universal Apostolic Preferences (UAPs), our charism and our context. Apostolic planning invites us, and I am inviting you, to let go of long-held assumptions and practices, to look anew for the Lord, to respond generously to his invitation, and to allow our hearts to be transformed.

On a practical level, over the coming year you may be asked to engage in spiritual conversations, participate in a one-on-one interview, serve as a facilitator or a listener, or assist in some other capacity. Please be generous with your time and approach this process with spiritual freedom, hope and imagination. I know there will be many graces along the way, not the least of which is the unity that will come from our shared work and sense of purpose. Thank you in advance for your prayerful participation and assistance.

I am grateful to Province Treasurer Ed Fassett, SJ, for serving as my delegate for apostolic planning and agreeing to manage what will be a 12 to 15-month process. Ed will be assisted by our consultant, Charlie Kelley, who led the then-U.S. Assistancy through its own strategic discernment in 2005.

How we embark on this prayerful province journey, this broad consultative endeavor, will be the task of the 12 members of our Steering Committee. A diverse group of Jesuit and lay partners, the Steering Committee members will help shape and oversee this critically important work. This will be a time and labor-intensive project, and I want to thank the committee members for their generous yes to my call. Please see the attachment to this letter for a list of the Steering Committee members and the organizations they represent.

Following is our expected timeline:

Fall of 2022: Conversation and Consultation

The Steering Committee will meet for the first time at the Curia in Portland next month from August 14 – 16. Following that meeting, we will begin an intensive period of conversation and consultation that will take place in our works, in our communities and perhaps regionally. This portion of the timeline is geared toward information gathering, research and facilitated conversations.

January – May 2023: Deliberations and Discernment

In the second semester, we move into a period of deliberations and information processing, where we will ask for input as we begin to consider different paths to take. The Steering Committee will assess information received (data, research, consultations, etc.) and craft the key apostolic questions for deliberation. At the conclusion of this period, the Steering Committee will process responses into a draft apostolic plan that will be submitted to me.

June 2023: Draft Plan & Response

In June of 2023, our intention is to present a draft plan to the province and invite your responses. In the next several weeks, I will provide more details on how we plan to do this.

Summer of 2023: Final Preparation

Next summer, I will work with the Provincial Assistants, who comprise my Cabinet, and representatives of each sector of the province to develop a final plan.

Fall of 2023: Approval of the Apostolic Plan

After approval, we will submit the plan to Jesuit Superior General Arturo Sosa, SJ, for his consideration and approval. Once approved by Fr. General, we will begin a process of carefully planned implementation.

In the coming weeks and months, I will reach out again with progress reports. We plan to establish a dedicated web page where we will post updates, reflections and more specifics about this process.

In just a few days, we will celebrate the feast of St. Ignatius, which also marks the conclusion of the Ignatian Year, the Society's worldwide commemoration of seminal moments in our history. As we thank God for our past, we look to the future and to the prayer and spiritual conversations that will animate our apostolic planning. Though we do not yet know where God is leading us, we know that we will walk this path together, growing in relationship, in trust and with a clearer sense of how we are being called to serve the people of God.

With prayers for all of you and for the work we now begin.

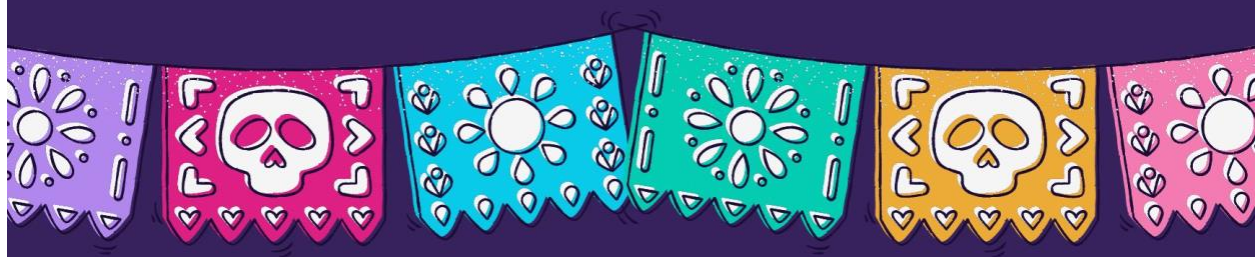

Retreatants commit themselves to praying daily, meeting twice monthly with a Spiritual Director and attending monthly retreats on Saturdays.

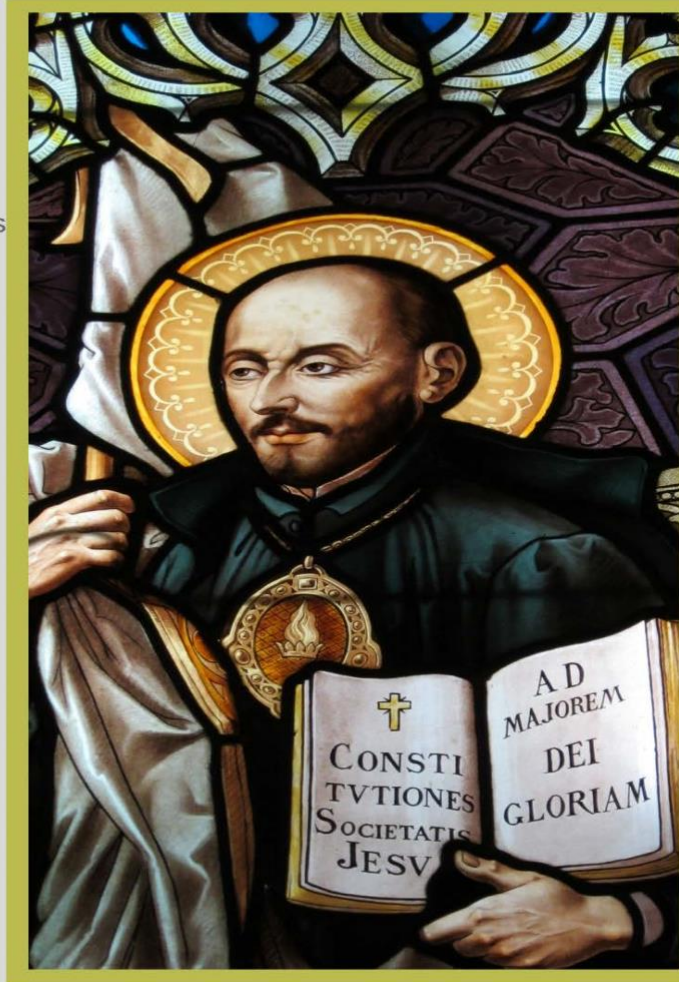

“ReAwaken America Tour Comes to Washington-Idaho Border”

We want to let you know about an event next month on the Washington-Idaho border that is the 15th iteration of a national movement called the [ReAwaken America Tour](#). It will be a Christian nationalist political rally at a raceway in Post Falls, Idaho, on September 16-17. Michael Flynn will be one of the featured speakers of the event, as well as other collaborators in the 2021 January 6th insurrection and members of the clergy. [FAN joined a letter with our colleagues in New York](#) and the National Council of Churches [in opposition to the recent stop of the tour at a church in Batavia, NY](#).

Standing against Christian nationalism is part of the public witness we are called to at Faith Action Network. At the FAN board and staff retreat this summer, we renewed our commitment to stand in support of those who experience hate and discrimination, especially in the name of religion. As a multifaith movement, we commit ourselves to continue standing against antisemitism, Islamophobia, racism, xenophobia, and anti-democratic movements. In our current climate, as Christian nationalism aligns with violence and anti-democracy movements, we raise our voices to say that this movement does not reflect FAN's shared values of love, justice, inclusion, equity, and compassion. There was a lot of financial distribution in the month as housing conditions are not improving and living expenses remain high.

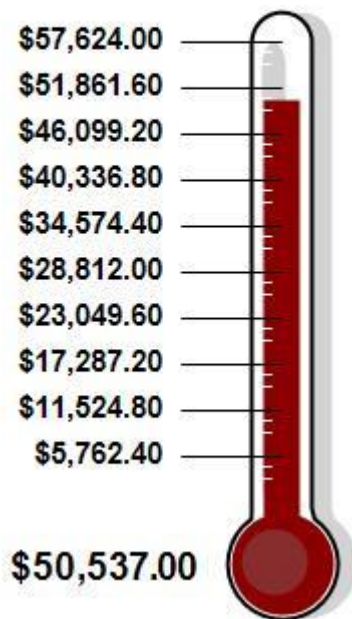
