



Dear People of St. Leo the Great Parish:

As you know, for several months the Archdiocese of Seattle has been engaged in a strategic pastoral planning process called Partners in the Gospel. This has included consultation with religious orders, such as the Jesuits, that have traditionally helped staff some of the Archdiocese's parishes. Now we are in an important public consultative phase of this process, and a draft proposal has been set before you for prayerful consideration.

As Provincial, I am encouraged by Archbishop Etienne's efforts to re-envision parish structures and am supportive of this process, the goal of which is to better meet the sacramental and pastoral needs of the people of God in our time.

The Province is impacted by the same challenges around priest resources that the Archdiocese and many other dioceses are experiencing. We simply cannot supply Jesuit pastors to all the parishes we once did. And in this context, I have shared with Archbishop Etienne that the Jesuits will no longer be able to staff a parish or parish family in Tacoma with a pastor.

Effective July 1, 2024, a diocesan pastor will be appointed to serve the parish family that will include St. Leo Parish. One or more parochial vicars/associate pastors will also be appointed to your new parish family. It is possible that one of those parochial vicars could be a Jesuit.

I also expect some Bellarmine Jesuits will be able to supply occasional help to the new parish families in Tacoma.

While the months and years ahead will mean significant change for St. Leo's and parishes throughout the Archdiocese, I believe your charism and identity as a parish is deeply embedded in the DNA of your community. Grounded in the Spiritual Exercises and in service of a faith that does justice, you have welcomed women and the laity into leadership, supported the Native American community, and cared for the urban poor. You will bring this charism into dynamic relationship with the other parish or parishes that will join you in a family, and they will gift you with their own traditions in return. From this relationship, over the next few years, you will discern together how to form a new parish, and create new forms of ministry, enriched by the gifts of the original communities.

I am also aware that these proposed changes come after several unsettled years in your parish, with difficult transitions in Jesuit presence and leadership and the upheaval of the pandemic.

The recent move of Father Pat Twohy, S.J. to California for needed healthcare has also been felt as a loss by many in your community. For this reason, I am grateful for the consultative nature of this present process, which allows for voices to be heard and feelings to be shared through both parish meetings and online platforms. It is a time to lean into one another and allow the Holy Spirit to speak in our hearts, guiding the community toward hope and a more sustainable future for parish families throughout Tacoma.

Archbishop Etienne has noted that this process is a Paschal journey, one that challenges us to embody the risen Christ. This is a journey that has included, from territorial days, the labors of Jesuits and other religious women and men in support of the Archdiocesan mission to serve the needs of God's people throughout Western Washington. The Jesuit partnership with the local church is not ending, but it is changing to meet the realities of the present time, guided by the light of the Gospel and in the footsteps of the risen Christ.

Please know of my prayers for you, the people of St. Leo's, as together we move through this time of change, as companions of the poor and humble Christ, and friends to one another on this unfolding journey of faith.

To improve online giving efficiency the parish will be changing its online giving platform from Vanco to Pushpay this September through November 2023. As we move to transition from Vanco to Pushpay as our giving platform, we wanted to share why this transition is occurring. We have been reviewing our giving options for over a year before making this decision. Pushpay provides an integrated solution with our new ParishStaq database. This database is being implemented at all parishes within the Archdiocese.

The new online giving platform will be a quick, easy, and secure way to donate.


