Dear Sisters and Brothers-

As the transition for Partners in the Gospel draws closer, I want to share with you a conversation I had with Fr. Michael Rademacher, the future pastor of St. Leo/St. Charles. He is recommending that our 9:30 am Sunday Mass be moved to 10:00 am. This adjustment will help him provide better coverage for St. Leo and St. Charles on Sundays. I discussed it with the members of the Parish Council and the staff, and they agreed with the proposed adjustment. The plan is to implement the adjustment the first weekend of July.

This adjustment would also benefit families with children, and hopefully, the L'Arche community because 9:30 am is too early for them to get to Mass. Overall, the time adjustment seems to be a change that will benefit St. Leo. The intention of Partners in the Gospel is not to make significant changes the first year. However, after consulting with some of you, I believe that going from 9:30 am to 10:00 am benefits Fr. Michael as well as St. Leo parish. However, we are not making this adjustment without consulting with you. Though I hope that the change will not create a major disruption for you, if you do have major concerns, please talk to me or to Fr. Phil.

Before Fr. Phil and I leave, you will also begin to see a change in the branding and "identity" of the parish. All the labels that say "A Jesuit Parish" will be taken down because St. Leo will no longer be a parish entrusted to the Society of Jesus. Yes, many of you will continue to carry the Jesuit charism, and in this way, the Ignatian spirit will continue to live in St. Leo.

On the weekend of June 22nd and 23rd, we will have a parish wide celebration after the 5:00 pm and 9:30 am Masses. This event will celebrate the history of St. Leo up until now. It will also be a time to ask for God's blessing as a new chapter in the history of St. Leo begins. Former pastors, Jesuits, and staff have been invited to the celebrations. It will be a casual event.

June 30th will be the last day for Fr. Phi and me. After the 30th, Fr. Michael and Fr. Marc Powell will be your pastoral leaders. Fr. Michael joined one of our staff meetings and he is looking forward to getting to know the parishioners, and the different programs and ministries of the parish.

Amid the uncertainty that you might be feeling, there also seems to be a sense of freedom. We all know that changes and transitions are difficult, but also, we know we do not do them alone. In times of change and transition, we are never alone. God is always with us. Those who have experienced significant transitions know, in retrospect, how God has accompanied them during challenging times.

Let us remain rooted in God's love as we journey together discerning the presence of the Risen Christ walking with us even as we lament our losses and unmet expectations. It is in moments like this that God draws closer to us.

We will have a parish wide celebration in gratitude for St. Leo's history, and to invoke God's blessings as St. Leo joins St. Charles Borromeo in a family model. This celebration will coincide with the weekend Liturgies. Continue watching this space for updates.

For years here at St. Leo, we have used glass vessels for our communion cups. Seeing the wine filling the cup is a powerful image for many. However, as beautiful as the glass cups are, they are also quite fragile. Yes, over the years some have broken when being washed, and they were simply replaced. However, not long ago, one of the cups actually broke during the distribution of the Sacrament, which brings up both an important safety issue and the question of how do we best handle with care the Blood of Christ. For this reason, we are moving to using metal cups; we now have some "on loan" from St. Joseph parish in Seattle.

We will start to use them the weekend of May 11 and 12 when we will make one other "tweak" to our communion procession. As many of you are aware, we sometimes have quite a "traffic jam" as people move from receiving the bread to receiving the cup. One thing we've tried is keeping the front row open, which has allowed a little more space for the movement. While this has helped a bit, the backup continues. To help address this, we will be changing our ratio of bread to cups. Currently, we have two breads to one cup, but instead we will have one bread to two cups (our gluten free minister will still be centrally located). We look forward to seeing how well this plan improves the flow of the procession.

L'Honey Update: Bee Notes: The hives were active this past week, thoroughly enjoying the warmer and sunnier weather. The healthier, over-wintered hives are expanding and beginning to set swarm cells. This reproductive process of making queen cells in anticipation of splitting off to make a new colony is a joyous time for the bees and has always given me hope. Some of the over-wintered hive have challenges. One hive that is struggling with a fungal infection known as Chalk Brood was setting both swarm queen cells as well as what is called supersedure queen cells that often are indications that the reigning queen is not doing well. With this colony I decided to make a "split" with these cells. A split is making an artificial swarm (new colony) with the queen cells. My hope is that the parent colony would be able to keep its original queen, if healthy, or work on continuing to raise a healthy replacement queen. If the parent colony falters on having a healthy queen, my plan would be to merge that split I made back with the parent colony, and they would both survive. However, if the parent colony recovers on its own, I will then have 2 colonies of bees instead of one!

Also, I have another hive with dysentery, or the possible gut infection known as Nosema. To try to help this hive, I have removed as many soiled bee frames and hive equipment as possible to lessen the infection load in the hive. I also gave it more honey as the colony's food supply was low. Often this infection will clear up as the weather warms and bees get out of the hive more often. There are some medications that may help but they are not always very effective. My hope is that the sunnier weather will help.

The honeybee and the wonders of Creation speak to me of the Divine. God has blessed me to be privileged to care for these little "Servant of Christ." My desire is to do them well that they may teach me of God and allow me to grow in humility before my Lord.

Peace Lutheran Community Meal: A Volunteer Role is Open

St. Leo Parish has been offering a community meal to the neighborhood for about 25 years and I have been coordinating this effort for 15 of those years. We serve two meals a year, one evening in October and one in April. It is a lot of fun and builds community and ecumenical cooperation! My reason for stepping down is that I simply have too much to do and had to cut back. I would like to see this long-standing parish tradition to continue, but I need someone to take over.


