

Blessings of our Lord Jesus Christ be with each of you!

As Catholics, it is important for us to remember that the mission of the Church is not only something that we have, but it is who we are. We are a community of all the baptized, bringing others into communion with Christ and putting the joy of the Gospel into concrete action.







Social Supportive Services: We do make positive differences in the lives of others.

J. W. will celebrate her 80th Birthday this month. She has worked all her life. Her last place of employment was working with the Internal Revenue Service, up until her health began to fail. She developed respiratory problems that finally took her out of the work force when she was 68 years old. She lived on a meager fixed income after that. Her budget was tight due to the cost of housing.

In January 2017 she reached out to St. Leo's for some assistance to cover a portion of her prescription costs as her finances could not cover all her living expenses. Almost every dime she had went to pay for the necessities of life. She relied on food banks and some assistance from us. From 2017 to 2019 her requests for assistance were mostly to help cover prescriptions cost. 2019 changed all that. In 2019 her rent was raised, and she was not able to cover it all. Again, she came to us for help as the needs were real and she was wise enough not to defer rental bills just because of COVID. J.W. spent most of her waking hours searching for more affordable and safe housing. Her health was frail and the anxiety of the prospect of homelessness or living in a violent situation was wearing her down. I told her if she would just keep on looking for housing that modestly met her needs, we would help with rent. St. Leo Church would not allow her to be pushed into the streets by greedy property management & private equity firms. During these dark times, she later confided in me that she had contemplating suicide to end the fear and anxiety, but faith in God kept her from the abyss. St. Leo's did not abandon this woman. We hung in there with faith and action. Over seven years, we supported J.W. with a total of approx. \$12,000.00 is assistance. She finally secured a safe and affordable home and can now have some peace. THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH.


