

The L'Honey Project/Youth Garden: Update on Bee Health & Future Steps

In the era of human induced climate change and the disruption of inter-species relationships, the wellbeing of all of God's creatures must be a priority for us humans. My shift in beekeeping practices try to reflect this property. It is bee health that is to be the "product" of beekeeping: honey and wax harvesting is secondary.

This past August, we caged 16 of the 32 queens in their perspective colonies (beehives) for 24 days. This caused the colonies with caged queens to become broodless. The Varroa Mites which are very damaging to the honeybees become vulnerable to oxalic acid treatment during periods of brood less time. Over the last two weeks we have been testing the hives for Varroa Mites and our results show that mite counts are lower in colonies that had their queens caged. So, we are on "track" regarding our hive treatment protocol but still need to make more adjustments. Once the queens were released, we treated the hives. However, I treated the colonies in the middle of the day when many of the bees were out foraging. Those bees did not get the effect of the Oxalic Acid treatment, thus blunting the overall mite treatment for the entire colony. This was an oversite on my part. My post-cage treatments should have been applied during the pre-dawn time of the day when all the bees are still in the hive.

So, this summer was a learning curve for me. As for now, we will continue to monitor and treat for Varroa Mite and feed colonies that need some assistance. I hope my efforts will bring about fewer colony losses this winter and bring about healthier bees in the spring. I will continue to improve my interventions for the sake of God's humble hard-working honeybees.

LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION

Please note that due to supply availability and approved sources, our gluten-free option has changed to a low-gluten host for Communion. This option is approved by our diocese and sourced through the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has approved them for use in all dioceses. The ingredients and their amounts are listed below.

Ingredients: Wheat starch (wheat flour from which most of the gluten protein has been removed) and water. The average gluten content per wafer is tested at 70 ppm, which equals 70 micrograms per 0.2 g of product. Each wafer weighs approximately 0.2 g.
