

### St. Leo Property Updates

April 2025

After many years of discussion and discernment, parish leadership made the hard decision to sell the parish's three rental properties last year. After reviewing the financials and the vision for expanding social justice ministries, it was clear that it would be irresponsible to continue on the current path.

Discussions around selling these properties have arisen several times over the past two decades, but with increased urgency due to the untenable pressure of operating and maintaining these properties. The reality is that the parish can no longer afford to do so. The lease income only covers 30% of the cost for taxes, insurance and maintenance. These aging buildings face several significant maintenance projects including gutters, roofs, siding, dry rot repairs, rodent abatement, interior water damage, interior and exterior painting, which is estimated ~\$612,000. The parish has no funds to cover these costs.

#### **Finances**

As good stewards of the parish budget, which is primarily comprised of donations from parishioners, parish leaders from the finance council, the pastoral council and staff - discussed that instead of investing scarce financial resources into aging buildings, it would make more sense to reallocate funding towards mission work that will impact many and uphold the social justice ministry work, which is at the heart of the parish.

Specifically, the proceeds from the sale of the properties will be used for three key priorities:

- 1. Campus Safety The parish has been in discussions with CCS and the Archdiocese of Seattle to improve campus safety, which has been a hot topic for some time now. Some of these proceeds will pay for a portion of a new fence that will encircle the entire campus, which includes the Tahoma Center and Nativity House. This fence project will increase the safety of staff, parishioners and the clients of our social service ministries. It is estimated to cost ~ \$1.3M of which the parish will cover half of the costs using the proceeds from the sale of the properties. Construction will begin in the next few months, and we will provide updates on its progress.
- Paying off the debt The parish carries a debt from the roof replacement project in 2023. Using some proceeds to help pay off this debt will remove it from our books and ultimately free up funding in the future.
- **3.** Mission Most importantly, a portion of the proceeds will be used to bolster the parish's mission and evangelization work such as Emergency Services, the expanded Laundry Service, Food Connection and overall social services.

At this moment, the first property has sold, the second property is in the sale process and the yellow apartments will be listed in the next few weeks. The parish is working with CCS and other local partners to help relocate some of the tenants. Please reach out to Shanon Koenen with any questions.

## Holy Thursday: Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper April 17 at 5:00 PM

On Holy Thursday, we remember the Last Supper. The Mass begins with the presentation of the sacred oils, blessed by the Archbishop.

During the Gospel, we hear how Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and gave us the command to do the same. We will respond by washing each other's feet. All are invited to participate—please consider wearing shoes that are easy to remove.

After Communion, there will be a procession with the Blessed Sacrament through the church to the altar of repose. Then, the main altar will be stripped.

The church will remain open for 30 minutes afterward for quiet prayer and reflection. During this Mass, please bring your Rice Bowl offerings forward when Fr. Marc invites you. Place them in the basket in front of the altar during the Offertory.

Extra Rice Bowls are available in your pews or in the hospitality area at the back of the church.

Platos de Arroz adicionales están disponibles en sus bancas o en el área de hospitalidad al fondo de la iglesia.




