




LITURGY SCHEDULE

St. Leo Property Updates, June 2025

Our construction project replacing the failed retaining wall at South 13th and G Streets and fencing of the campus is well underway. A new retaining wall designed by structural and Geotechnical engineers is near completion.


Although fencing materials were ordered months ago, delivery has been delayed and is now expected late July to Early August. There will be a break in construction during the week of June 30 – July 4.

On Monday July 7, the 14th Street access from Yakima Avenue to the parking lot will be closed, to enable saw cutting, excavation and pouring concrete for the gate track for this driveway. There will also be some excavation in the parking lot on July 7 between the Food Connection Entrance and into the flower bed adjacent to that entrance to repair a blocked drainage line that floods into the Food Connection entrance during rainfall.

You may notice some additional tree trimming was done to enable new fencing to be placed along G Street on the outward side of the parking lot light poles. This placement is done to prevent ongoing property destruction and theft of power and wiring, which damages and disables the parking lot lights.

We will provide further updates as construction proceeds.

Reflections from the Bee Yard & Corpus Christi: A Way of Being

I write this reflection on the morning of Corpus Christi Sunday -3:00am. Stress & worry often wake me up, so I just get up and pray the rosary as it grounds me in the Communion of Saints and dearest Mother Mary who is a life model for me. Another life model for me is Honeybee. She lives with deep purpose, devoted to the hive and to the wellbeing of future generations. It seems that the lowly ones are often our guides to the Divine.

War, anger, frustration, tightly held inflexible beliefs, hurts, destruction, stress, worry and fear – All Distractions.

We have one beehive at the rectory office at St. Leo's called: The St. Leo Hive. All my hives have numbers and names that helps me keep my records straight as I labor to keep them healthy. Well, the St. Leo hive sits behind the building facing what seems a bit like moonscape. It is a desolate construction site of barren soil, construction debris and cold lifeless concrete. This is what our Sister Honeybee sees as she sets off on her flights each day in search of nectar, pollen and water for her baby sisters and brothers. She is not distracted by what seems to be a desolate wasteland. NO, she is guided by her will, maybe instinct or dare I say God's design for her!

She is to be good news to all. To the flowers she pollinates that give us all life and to future generations she feeds. In the end, she gives her all for others and the glory of God.

As Father Michael mentioned at mass this past Saturday eve, celebrating the Feast of Corpus: Christi – Christ gathered broken and shared. The act of giving life to others. This is what we are called to do and to be. Life and Good News to others.

Our Parish Family Update – July 2025 Parish Family #35- St. Charles and St. Leo

In July 2024, the Archdiocese of Seattle formed 60 parish families from 136 parishes. This was a milestone in the Partners of the Gospel strategic pastoral planning process focused on reenvisioning parish life. As a parish family, we have begun asking ourselves: How can we look at the resources we have – people, properties, finances – and use them to support the mission of Jesus Christ: to go make disciples? How can we ensure this mission remains at the heart of the Catholic Church in Western Washington? Partners in the Gospel is an opportunity to renew our commitment to this mission, while re-envisioning parish life in a new structure.

Currently, our parish family is in the process of listening to its people before we start the work of creating a One Parish Plan to form our One Canonical Parish.

Our One Canonical Parish will have one parish name while individual church buildings may retain their specific names, one pastor, one finance council, with the goal of completing this task by 2027.

Our first Community Listening Session took place at St. Leo on May 30, 2025. Our second and last Community Listening Session will occur at St. Charles on June 27th at 6 pm. Recordings of the sessions and comments will be posted on our websites.

Listening Sessions specifically tailored to the work of the One Parish Plan are to come and will be led by the PFAC (Parish Family Advisory Council).

Fr. Michael is discerning who will be included on the PFAC which will be formed by the end of summer. If you have any recommendations for parishioners who are prayerful, peaceful, familiar with both campuses, represent those groups who are underrepresented, able to commit to the timeline; meeting monthly, and wants to further the growth of the parish family as a whole, they would be a great candidate for the PFAC. With input from both communities and adherence to Archdiocesan guidelines, shared accountability is essential in developing the One Parish Plan.
