The Intersection of Faith and the Works of Justice IS Parish Life:

Musings from the Bee Yard

The bees are well into the "high noon" of summer. The black berry blooms are now transforming into green fruit as petals fall. It seems like the fruit is setting earlier than in years past. This yields less nectar for the bees, and the nectar dearth of the summer starts earlier and lasts longer. The bees and Creation are under more stress from the hubris and disregard by humankind.

I find myself apologizing to my sisters the honey bees, the woodlands and meadows more often. I hope they can understand my feeble care attempts; all the while having to live and work out of this increasingly misguided human society. I hope that they can sense my broken heart and sadness over their plight. My deliverance is that they may see that I grieve for them.

My faith tells me that God is Incarnate in Jesus Christ. If that is so, then all of Creation speaks of the Divine! This is what I cleave to, and it gives me hope. Maybe someday we will have ears to listen.

I am called to be hopeful and that is why I keep trying to be a friend to the little ones, the honeybees under my care.

In a few weeks we will begin to cage the queens for 24 days. This causes no harm to the queen but prevents the queen from laying eggs, causing the colony to be broodless. In this condition and after the 24-day period the Varroa Mite which causes so much damage, is most vulnerable to treatment. The Varroa Mite populations in colonies must be eliminated or kept at low population levels for colonies to be healthy and to fend the mites off naturally. The bees deserve my best effort! God cares for the little ones and so should I!
