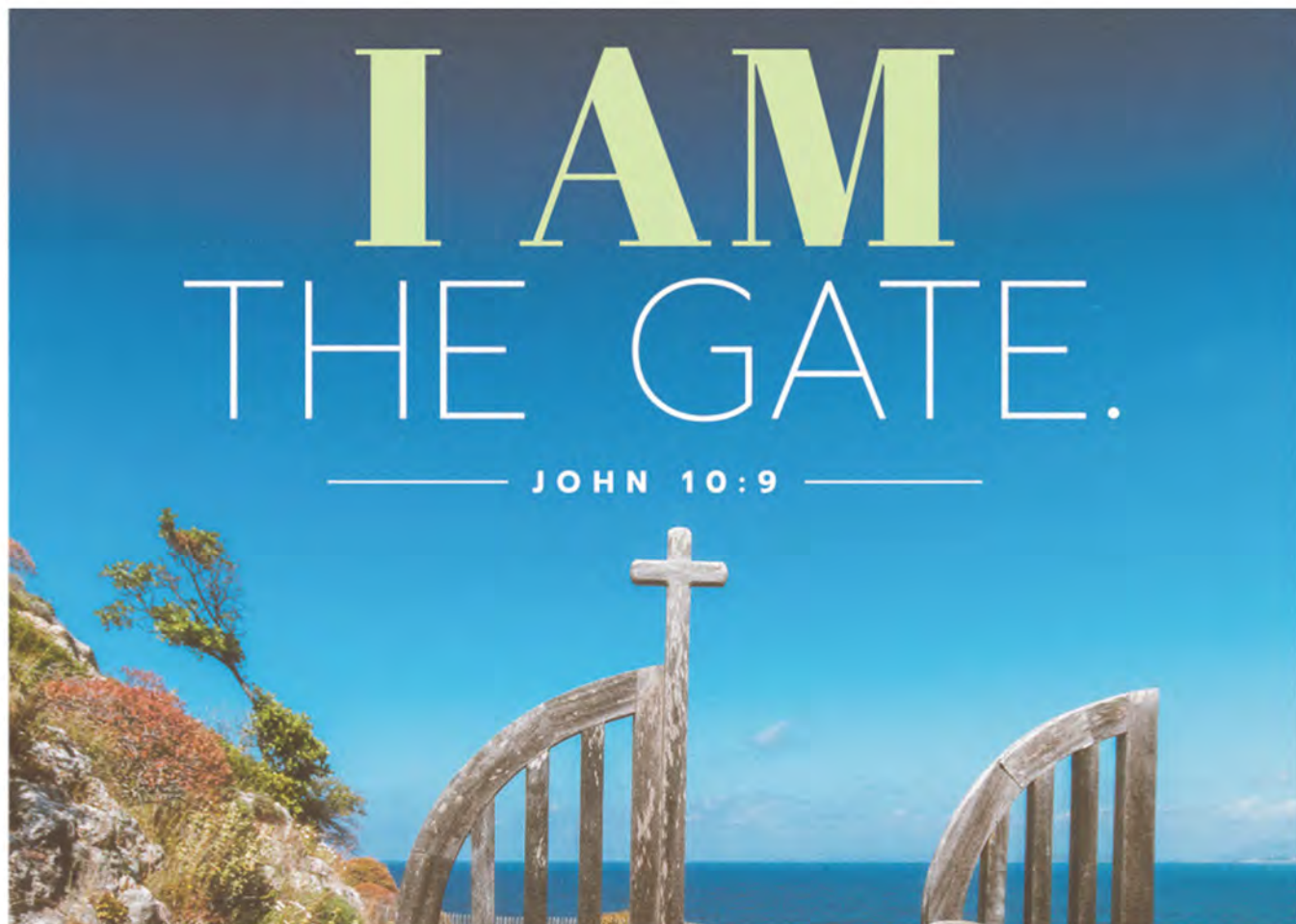

Blessings

Our soon-to-be one canonical parish is blessed with an extraordinary richness of gifts. We are blessed with two distinct but deeply complementary charisms—the vibrant social-justice heart and radical hospitality of St. Leo, and the strong school community, resources, and stability of St. Charles—now brought together for a shared mission. We are blessed with diverse cultures, languages, and spiritual traditions, including Hispanic, Filipino, Native American, long-time Anglo parishioners, and many others whose presence reflects the universality of the Church. We are blessed with people who care fiercely about their parish, who show up, speak honestly, and long for unity, healing, and renewal. We are blessed with a wide range of gifts and talents—teachers, nurses, social workers, musicians, catechists, elders with wisdom, young families with energy, and parishioners eager to serve. We are blessed with a powerful commitment to the poor and marginalized, a legacy especially strong at St. Leo and now strengthened by the combined parish's broader base. We are blessed that our two campuses are appropriately placed for their ministries, and that their close proximity is a true advantage—especially compared to other parish families facing great distances between sites. We are blessed with clergy who serve together, as seen so beautifully in the unified Triduum, and with lay leaders willing to guide the parish through a thoughtful, transparent discernment process. And we are blessed with hope—the sense, growing stronger after Easter, that God is doing something new among us, inviting us not to preserve two separate histories but to build a vibrant, united, mission-driven Catholic community that is stronger together than either parish could be alone.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS

John and Carol are a couple in their late 50's who lost their jobs for health reasons. For the past three years they have been living in their car while working to get low-income housing. They were recently able to secure housing but needed assistance with their deposit. They called our St Vincent DePaul "Help Line" and we were able to help with their deposit and to provide some furniture assistance as well as food cards. After three long years, they are finally out of their car and living in an apartment.

We would not be able to provide this assistance without your support! Your generous donations each month enable us to provide \$10,000-12,000 per month for rent and utility assistance, food and gas cards, as well as bringing the hands and feet of Christ to them through our home visits. We share with our "neighbors" that the support they are receiving would not be possible without the generosity of caring, loving people in our parish. For each person we help, we also do a home visit and we pray with them. We also encourage them to join a faith-congregation if they do not already belong to one, especially St. Leo and St. Charles.

Thank you for your generous support! If you would like to join over 40 other people from our parish visiting those in need or answering their phone calls, we invite you to join our St Vincent DePaul Conference. We meet the first Sunday of each month in the junior high religion classroom. The next meeting is Sunday, May 3, following the 10:00am Mass.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Contrary to belief, an anointing is not just for those who are actively dying. One can receive an anointing if they are severely ill, are about to have surgery, are actively dying or any other emergency circumstances.

If you or your family member have been Baptized Catholic, and are in need of an anointing please call the office at 253-564-5185. If you are in need of an anointing for someone who is actively dying (outside office hours), please call the emergency line at 253-564-5185. and press 2.

Attending Mass and in need of an anointing? No problem. Fr. Michael and Fr. Marc welcome you to be anointed after any Mass! Just stand/sit by the Baptismal font and they will meet you after Mass.

PREGNANCY AID

Pregnancy Aid of Tacoma is a 501c3 non-profit organization, our services are free, and our staff are all Catholic volunteers. We serve the well-being of families with children in the womb to five years old by providing material and emotional support in the Tacoma area for over 50 years. Last year Pregnancy Aid served over 300 clients of which 136 were new clients. We gave out over 30,000 diapers, 70 newborn layettes, and gave out over 90 large baby items (cribs, strollers, highchairs, swings, etc.).
