EXPLAINING SYNODALITY

A great time of year to explain synodality

As we approach the end of the Easter season, it's very appropriate to reflect on the work of the Holy Spirit and the life of the Church. And, with both Pope Leo and Archbishop Etienne talking a lot about synodality, now is a great time to talk about what that means. Ultimately, synodality is about letting the Holy Spirit lead us in a process of listening, observing, and acting as a Church.

Pope Leo asks us to do this because he is confident that the Holy Spirit is still leading us. Archbishop Etienne believes that too. And Archbishop knows we need to listen to the Spirit as we move toward becoming one parish. He really wants this process to be one that engages all of us in becoming more active in the faith and sharing it with others.

The Book of Acts shows us what synodality looks like

The 15th chapter of Acts provides an excellent example of the Church exercising synodality. The early Church faced a very serious question: do followers of Jesus need to follow Jewish purity and dietary laws? With some notable exceptions, Jesus and his disciples followed these laws. But, after Pentecost, many non-Jews were drawn to join the faith. With Jesus founding the new covenant, would those non-Jews be expected to observe the Mosaic covenant?

The apostles gathered from distant cities to discuss this question. Feelings were strong, but they grounded their discussion in an openness to the Holy Spirit. They understood and respected the way the Mosaic covenant had guided God's people. St. Paul shared the extraordinary experience of his travels where the Holy Spirit inspired conversion of so many new people. He also shared how some 'ceremonial' parts of the Mosaic law created obstacles for Gentiles who wanted to follow Jesus. The apostles listened, prayed, and realized the Holy Spirit was calling them to release gentiles from the obligations of the Old Covenant to lead them into the life of the New Covenant.

Respecting what has gone before and listening for what God wants us to do next

Authentic synodality should always lead us into a deeper relationship with Jesus and it respects the work of the Church. At the opening of the first synod on synodality, Pope Francis reassured those gathered that "synodality is a spiritual process of listening and discernment, not a process of rewriting doctrine."

Archbishop Etienne believes this process is particularly helpful as we prepare to join St. Charles and St. Leo into one canonical parish. Listening carefully helps us engage our community and see where the Holy Spirit is at work in our community. When we listen, pray and reflect on the work of the Spirit, that helps us to know how we can see our ministry as a process of being obedient to the Spirit and creating room for greater work in our community. The work of evangelization becomes much easier when we approach our work, not as something that depends upon our power, but as a collaboration with the Holy Spirit.

Evangelization is the goal

Both Pope Leo and Archbishop Etienne have emphasized synodality as a strategy for evangelization. These successors of the same apostles who met at the Council of Jerusalem want our Church to be more thoughtful, open, and responsive in our ministries. The better we become at listening and observing the movement of the Holy Spirit, the better we will be at engaging the people of our community and continuing the good work begun long ago by our Lord.

Pregnancy Aid of Tacoma is a 501c3 non-profit organization, our services are free, and our staff are all Catholic volunteers. We serve the well-being of families with children in the womb to five years old by providing material and emotional support in the Tacoma area for over 50 years. Last year Pregnancy Aid served over 300 clients of which 136 were new clients. We gave out over 30,000 diapers, 70 newborn layettes, and gave out over 90 large baby items (cribs, strollers, highchairs, swings, etc.).
